

Woodend School Programs Frequently Asked Questions

1) Where do we park?

Please let us know during registration how your group will arrive to the sanctuary (bus/cars). All vehicles should enter from Jones Mill Rd and exit at Brierly Rd.

- Buses should park in the first pull off on the right (see [map](#)). Your group can get off the bus into the adjacent open grassy area where your naturalist will meet you.
- If your group is arriving in separate cars, please park and meet your naturalist in the parking lot at the top of the hill on the north side of the driveway (see [map](#)).

2) What if we are running late?

3) Do you have restrooms and water fountains?

- Two wheelchair-accessible, composting restroom facilities are available at the East Trailhead, as well as a water fountain with bottle filler. Additional restrooms are in the main building. (see [map](#))

4) Can you accommodate persons with disabilities?

- Our main trail and boardwalks are wheelchair accessible. Let us know any special needs of your group during registration so we can ensure a positive and inclusive experience for everyone.

5) Can we eat lunch on the grounds? What do we do with our garbage?

- We welcome you to enjoy a snack or lunch at Woodend. We encourage you to adopt [waste-free lunch](#) goals. Please bring a bag for trash and leave it by the bathrooms at the East Trailhead (see map). The Future Play Space area near the East Trailhead has plentiful log and stump seating and is a great place for unstructured nature play "recess."

6) What is the inclement weather policy?

- ANS School Field Trips are held rain or shine. In case of dangerous weather (ex: heavy rain, high winds or thunderstorms) you will have the opportunity to reschedule. If you choose not to reschedule you will be fully refunded minus a \$25 fee.

7) How much does a program cost?

- Each one-hour field trip program is \$200 for a group of up to 32 children, plus chaperones.

8) How many students can attend?

- Each one-hour field trip program is limited to a maximum of 32 children. If your group is larger, please register for the 10am session and the 11:15am session on the same day. Half of your group can gather for snack or other activities while the other half is on the trail with our naturalists.

9) What happens if more than the maximum number of students come on the field trip?

- ANS will charge an additional \$10 for each child that attends beyond the registration limit.

10) How many chaperones do you require?

- Groups must bring at least one responsible adult per 15 children. We do not limit the number of chaperones, but suggest no more than 6 to keep the group manageable. Please note that the group's teachers and chaperones are responsible for general behavior management.

11) What themes do you offer?

- In Spring 2022, as we rebuild our field trip program after a pandemic hiatus, we will offer two themes: Discovery Hunt (suitable for Pre-K to 2nd grade) and Habitats (suitable for grades K-5).

12) What days/times do School Field Trips run?

- Field trip programs are currently offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays. There are two sessions available each day, 10am to 11am and 11:15am to 12:15pm. If your group is larger than 32 children, please register for both sessions.

13) How do I register?

14) What is your cancellation policy?

- For cancellations 4 weeks or more in advance, you will receive a full refund minus a \$25 fee. 2-4 weeks in advance you will receive a 50% refund minus a \$25 fee. Cancellations less than 2 weeks in advance will not be issued any refund, however we may be able to reschedule your group. Cancellations and date/time changes must be e-mailed to brenna.houck@anshome.org.
- Should ANS have to cancel your program for any reason, such as those related to COVID-19, you will be issued a full refund if rescheduling is not possible.
- Registration fees are nonrefundable.

16) How should we dress?

- Our programs are held entirely outside. Please dress for the weather and wear sturdy, closed-toed shoes such as sneakers.

17) What are your COVID policies?

- We follow the guidelines of the Montgomery County Department of Health as they are updated. Field trip programs are conducted entirely outdoors. We encourage the use of face masks, even outdoors and require them for entry to our building.

10:45 am	At the pond, we look for animals that make the water their home.
11:00 am	Time for a picnic lunch and nature play.
